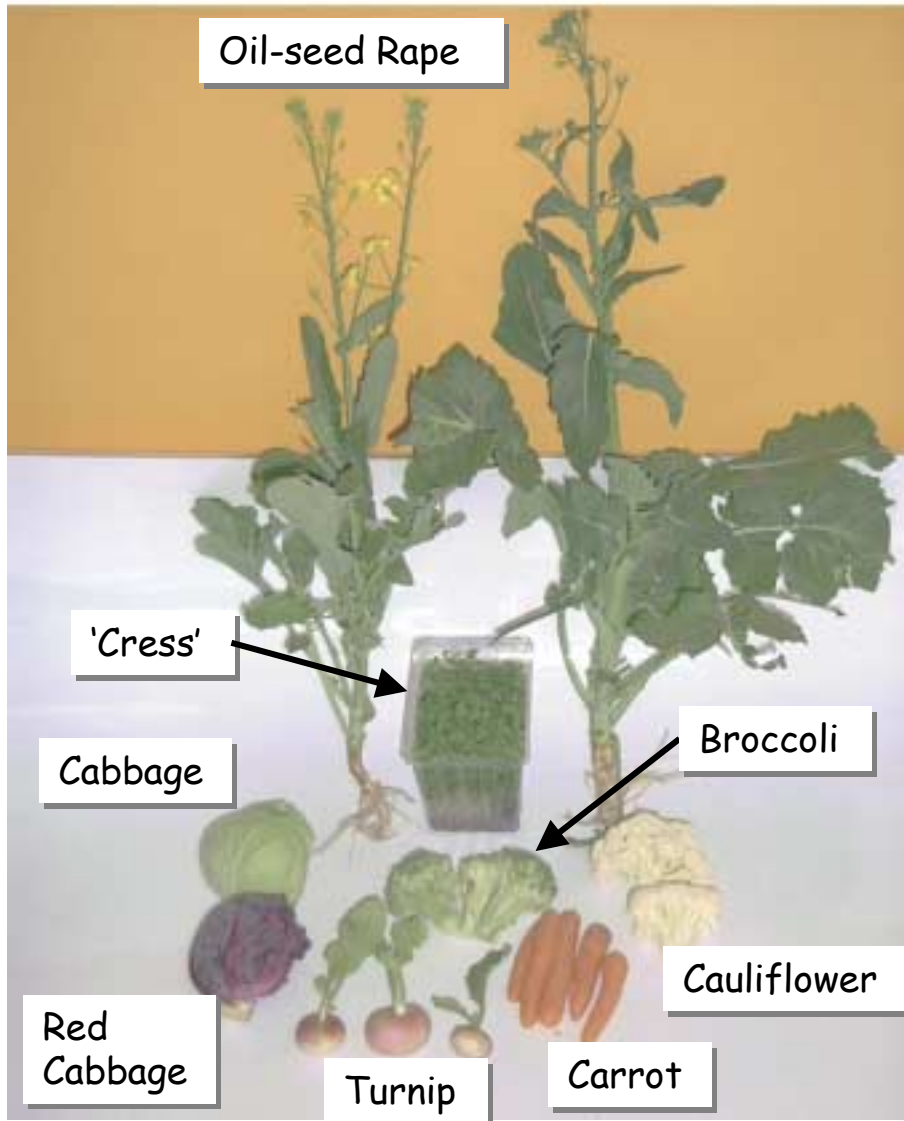


Which is the 'odd one out' ?



Answer: Carrot, all of the others are brassica varieties and can be crossed to each other even though they are very different in form (like dogs)

Supplimentary information

For **each** of these vegetables, our ancestors spotted unusual variation amongst normal plants.

These would have had abnormally large roots, or denser leaves, or tastier / oilier seeds, or unusual flowers or buds.

Our ancestors selected these interesting mutants and drove their genetics by repeated breeding and selection cycles to modify the plants for their (and our) convenience and preference.

None of our modern crops existed before farmers from prehistoric to medieval times modified them in this way.
....and the process continues today.
